Anna Fagotto: President of the Security Council

Why did you decide to take this challenge ?

I believe that the Security Council is really important especially because we are looking at our world that is changing very fast; moreover it deals with the last breaking news. So I decided to take part in the Security Council exactly because I think that it is very challenging.

Are you satisfied with the involvement of the delegates in the committee?

Yes, the first day there were just two delegates who were fighting, the Russian Federation delegate and the UK delegate, but today I saw all the delegates much more involved in the debate, especially the new delegates. In fact, although they are in the Security Council they haven't had a lot of experience but after they understood what they have to do, they became quite enthusiastic.

Did the delegates find a valid solution to improve the situation in Syria?

I understand perfectly that it's very difficult; in fact while I was analysing the problem for the chair report, I found it very difficult to solve and to understand of course. Even though they tried, the resolution isn't very effective but neither is the UN one!

And what has come out with reference to the question of immigration through Europe?

Immigration through Europe was a very

much debated topic, we had many different opinions but the resolution approved was very effective because they pointed out the need of cooperation through the European states. I think that this is one of the biggest problems here in Europe: cooperate to create something together is a good way to solve problems.

relevant resolution approved?

Well, we approved two resolutions, even if in the Security Council you can just approve one resolution for one topic. I think that, as I said before, the second resolution, the one about the immigration through the European states, it is much more effective since it was an easier topic.

Which countries have been the most active?

Well, yesterday the Russian Federation and the UK had different opinions, so they were very much involved in the debate. I could say it was a "couple" de-

bate! I think UK is the most involved and the most prepared one; I am impressed because even if he is Italian from a scientific high school his English is very good. Also the new delegate from Australia even though she hasn't had any other experience, she is pretty much involved and today she submitted the resolution. I am very happy about that because I have also prepared them for the debate.

Have you noticed any conflicts or alliances between the states?

Oh yes! Today we had a great alliance between Russian federation, China (I don't know how) and Jordan for some amendments and before submitting the amendments they were passing many notes to make the amendments to be approved by everybody. I was very happy about that!

How did your delegates behave?

They are so good, I mean I don't have to tell them they mustn't use the phone; today the delegate of China's mobile phone rang during the conference and then he was so upset and told me: "sorry seriously it won't happen again, it is a promise!" and I was like "ok, it is not a problem, you weren't using it!" So they are really good and they behave in a perfect way.

Human Rights

Everyone was very serious by the end of Friday evening, discussing the complicated topic of the integration of refugees and the protection from terrorists. The resolution was about the creation of networks between World Heritage Sites and in the end, was passed by a margin of only three votes. Seven dele-



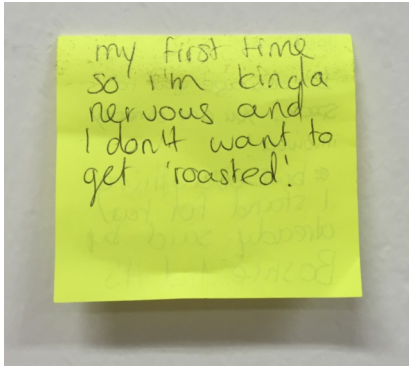

<p>After a terrorist attack in Rome, the Schengen Agreements have just been cancelled within the European Union (EU) and border controls have been strengthened. The EU will no longer welcome refugees, regardless of their country of origin. Italy, together with Spain and UK have announced they will defect to missions aimed at rescuing migrants at sea, such as Frontex. Furthermore, Estonia, Bosnia Herzegovina, Belgium, Germany, France and Belgium have signed an exclusive pact in which they commit themselves to repatriate all the refugees that have already been welcomed to these countries. These refugees have already been gathered, as an emergency, into isolated refugee camps.</p>	<p>During a military operation of the Kurd Defense Forces in northern Syria, near the border with Iraq against the forces of the Islamic State (IS), weapon storages, including biological and nuclear devices, have been found. The commander of the YPG (People's Defense Units) in the area of Qamishli, Giwan Ibrahim, and the General Commander of the YPJ (Women's Defense Units), Nessrin Abdallah declared that the weapons found are part of the secret nuclear arsenal of the former Iraqi dictator Saddam Hussein.</p>	<p>A huge dam between Brazil and Paraguay has collapsed due to lack of maintenance and the two countries don't want to admit their responsibility or to refund the damages. The victims are 23 among workers and civilians. The electronic system that monitored the dam is Japanese. Several hundreds of Paraguayans are missing. The estimated territory devastated by the collapse is of 450 km². As the dam gives electricity to 95% of Paraguay and two important Brazilian cities, Rio de Janeiro and Sao Paulo, there have been several blackouts leaving without electricity 23 million of inhabitants, And both the flora and the fauna in the lands close to the dam have been devastated.</p>	<p>A sequence of explosions in the centre of Rome destroyed a consistent part of the Colisseum. The Islamic State (IS) claimed the attack and declared that the Tempietto Longobardo of Cividale del Friuli is under threat. The prefect of Rome asked the government to declare the State of Emergency in the city and Italian Prime Minister immediately returned in Italy from Paris, where he was preparing for the United Nations Climate Change Conference, (COP) 2015. The Minister of the Interior immediately signed the resignation from his role. Fortunately, there have been no victims.</p>
